Luke 5:16 MSG

Soon a large crowd of people had gathered to listen and be healed of their sicknesses. As often as possible Jesus withdrew to out-of-the-way places for prayer.

Luke 22:39-44 NLT

Then, accompanied by the disciples, Jesus left the upstairs room and went as usual to the Mount of Olives. There he told them, "Pray that you will not give in to temptation." He walked away, about a stone's throw, and knelt down and prayed, "Father, if you are willing, please take this cup of suffering away from me. Yet I want your will to be done, not mine." Then an angel from heaven appeared and strengthened him. He prayed more fervently, and he was in such agony of spirit that his sweat fell to the ground like great drops of blood.

This is what we see Jesus model. He took time away from his important work and ministry to be renewed. He would withdraw so that he could gain the strength to continue on.

To Renew means to:

-the replacing or repair of something that is worn out, run-down, or broken.

-changing into something new and different, something better.

-to make like new or restore to freshness.
