We imagine this first couple, everything being perfect, because we get the whole story. They get the high honor and privilege of bringing the savior into the world. We think of it being a Whoville like experience, but it would have been anything but that in their ancient culture.

According to Hebrew marriage customs marriages were usually arranged and contracts/conditions were made. After this they were considered married but they would remain in their original households for another year 3 of a waiting period that would demonstrate their pledge to purity. If the bride were to violate those purity terms, the marriage could be annulled, because it signified that the wife was not faithful to the pledge of purity.
